Principal activity

Our focus during this year has been to make our Community Benefit Strategy fully operational through our community grants, our helpdesk, our innovation projects and our support to local community energy projects. We are report on progress in detail below.

Looking to the future, a key aspect of our Community Benefit Strategy will be about how we can make our impact as large as possible by adding other grants and contracts to our funding and by working in partnership with others. To that end, we have been working this year on a bid for a £3.2m European Regional Development Fund project. We have been working on it in partnership on it with 5 major local organisations, including the two universities, Oxford City Council, Cherwell District Council and Bioregional. We hope to bring the bid to fruition and start working on it during the next financial year.

Our community benefit spend in detail

In accordance with The Low Carbon Hub IPS Limited's Company aims and objectives, surpluses from projects that have been live for at least one year are passed to The Low Carbon Hub CIC in the form of a Community Benefit Donation.

This income is further bolstered by funds from a number of additional income streams including surpluses from two CIC owned installations in Eynsham, donations, grant funding, ad hoc donations and the return of *option to recover* loans made in previous years.

Eynsham GreenTEA Grant £804

Half of the net profits from the CIC owned installations in Eynsham are donated to Eynsham GreenTEA in recognition of their support in making the project happen. In 2015/16 these funds helped support a number of local activities carried out by the group, including:

- An external display board for the village hall to show changing information on solar panel performance and how much energy power appliances use.
- Running free events including a swapshop, and a combined energy and apple festival.
- Servicing and insuring a thermal imaging camera which is used locally and lent to other groups.
- Building up a library of sample energy saving materials and equipment including an LED bulb library.
- Supporting Need not Greed, and the setting up of a community orchard.

Community Benefit Management £3,163

We believe that investing in good management of our community benefit is important to ensure its effective use. This includes overall strategy development, monitoring and reporting, to ensure learning is fed back into the organisation. 1 General information

The company is a Community Interest Company limited by shares incorporated in United Kingdom.

2 Accounting policies

Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 Section 1A - The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006.

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared using the historical cost convention except that as disclosed in the accounting policies certain items are shown at fair value.

The Low Carbon Hub C.I.C meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS102.

Revenue recognition

Turnover comprises the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for the sale of goods and services in the ordinary course of the company's activities. Turnover is shown net of sales/value added tax, returns, rebates and discounts.

Other grants

Grant income is recognised in full only when conditions for receipts have been met and, in the case of grants for specific projects, associated project expenditure has been incurred. When projects are in progress at the year-end, or where they have not yet started, grants are carried forward as deferred income to the extent needed to fund anticipated costs on the projects.

Tax

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date in the countries where the company operates and generates taxable income.

Depreciation

Depreciation is charged so as to write off the cost of assets, other than land and properties under construction over their estimated useful lives, as follows:

Trade debtors

Trade debtors are amounts due from customers for merchandise sold or services performed in the ordinary course of business.

Trade debtors are recognised initially at the transaction price. They are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. A provision for the impairment of trade debtors is established when there is objective evidence that the company will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables.

Stocks

Work in progress is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after due regard for obsolete and slow moving stocks. Net realisable value is based on selling price less anticipated costs to completion and selling costs. Cost includes all direct costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.
