





Ray Valley Solar (RVS)



- Produced **19,954,702 kWh** last financial year.
- 103% of predicted output.
- Bi-facial panels continue to boost efficiency at the site.




- Generated **776,877 kWh** last financial year.
- Upgrades at the site have improved generation. Whilst still below target, upward trend is encouraging.
- Installed solar panels on turbine house and over the screws.
- Early flooding events effects production over the winter.




- Portfolio produced3,455,584 KWh.
- Reached 97% of target generation.
- Automated billing system improving efficiency and enabling real-time monitoring of sites, improving site availability.

The coming year offers strong generation growth through:


- Further Sandford Hydro upgrades planned with battery storage on the horizon.
- Rooftop solar PV portfolio will continue to grow.












- Securing a strategic funding approach by councils





Large grants awarded

- Low Carbon Oxford North to continue their 'Housewarming' workshops and events

Small grants awarded

- Oxford Friends of the Earth to develop materials for the National Lobby of Parliament
- Go Green Hanborough to produce materials for stalls and workshops helping residents reduce energy use
- Low Carbon East Oxford to carry out energy saving improvements in homes

We provide and support a regular programme of workshops, training and events for community group members.




















Fixed Assets - amounts £GBP Spent




There was an increase in assets due to the following:

- Installation of Norbar 3: £221k
- Repowering of Norbar 1: £20k (net)
- Ongoing works at Sandford Hydro: £159k (net)
- Portal interface: £84k

Assets disposed of during the year included:

- One component of the Osney Supercharge asset, which was transferred to a homeowner.
- The battery at Rose Hill School, which was removed following the completion of a successful trial.



Turnover Highlights

- Turnover increased by £194k, reaching £2,945k.
- Ray Valley Solar: +£130k
- Sandford Hydro Limited: +£45k
- IPS: +£18k (offset by downtime of major asset *Norbar 1* during the summer).

Deferred Revenue

- The IPS Group holds £4,474k in LEO Grant Capital Project balances.
- These will be recognised as Deferred
 Revenue over the lifetime of the projects.




- Aim over time to eliminate all debt (other than long-term project debt).
- New debt or bonds if required should be at less than we pay to shareholders.
- The debt-to-equity ratio should not be more than 50:50.

How is the IPS Group funded?

As at year end – total £15.9m funding

- £337k net share raises in the year.
- Oxford City Council are providing an operational loan of £3.8m at the year-end. £100k Fish Pass Loan repaid April 2025
- Triodos Bank long-term operational loan for Ray Valley Solar is £1.9m [2024: £2.2m].






Hopeful graph of the year


Renewables will be the world's top power source 'by 2026'

Global electricity generation by source, TWh




